ORDINANCE NO. 150-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BIGHORN-DESERT VIEW WATER AGENCY PROVIDING FOR COMPENSATION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency is a public agency of the State of California organized and existing pursuant to the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency Law at Deering's Water Code – Uncodified Acts, Act 90; and

WHEREAS, the per diem compensation for the Members of the Board of Directors was established by Ordinance No. 140-01 to be One Hundred and Ten Dollars and Twenty-Five cents (\$110.25); and

WHEREAS, Water Code, Section 20202 authorizes an increase in the per diem compensation of members of the Agency's Directors not to exceed five percent (5%) per calendar year and the Board of Directors desires to increase the per diem compensation by five percent (5%) to One Hundred and Fifteen Dollars and Seventy-Six cents (\$115.76) for the Fiscal Year 2015/2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The amount of compensation to be received by a Director for each day's attendance at a meeting of the Board and for each day's service rendered at the request of the Board shall be One Hundred and Fifteen Dollars and Seventy-Six cents (\$115.76). The only meetings, service, and events for which said compensation shall be paid shall be those provided for in the Policy for Reimbursement of Actual and Necessary Expenses for Board Members.

<u>Section 2.</u> No Director shall receive the compensation set forth in Section 1 of this Ordinance for more than 10 days in any calendar month.

<u>Section 3.</u> Pursuant to Section 20204 of the Water Code, this Ordinance shall become effective sixty (60) days from the date of its adoption. This Ordinance hereby supersedes previous Ordinance No. 14**0**-01.



SUMMARY

Staff has obtained quotes from John Deere and Johnson/CAT to supply a new backhoe. The Johnson/CAT bid is approximately 8% higher than the John Deere bid. Staff recommends purchase of a 2015 John Deere 410K backhoe at a cost of \$152,479.39.

This would be a capital purchase reimbursable from the cash reserves being transferred to Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Board considers taking the following action(s):

1. Authorize General Manager to purchase one 2015 John Deere 410K backhoe and associated equipment from RDO Equipment, Riverside, CA at a total cost of \$152,479.39.

BACKGOUND/ANALYSIS

Staff identified the need for one new backhoe for the expanded operations at time the Plan for Service and application for the annexation of CSA 70 Zone W1 (Goat Mountain) was approved by the Board in April 2014.

During the proceedings staff was informed that the W1 system owns a 1982 Ford backhoe. Due to its age and condition, staff recommends proceeding with the purchase of a new backhoe as planned.

In anticipation of the July 1, 2015 transition date, staff has sought bids for the backhoe from John Deere and Johnson/CAT. All items considered, including consultation with neighboring water district operations staff, the John Deere 410K is the preferred piece of equipment and prices approximately 8% lower than the Johnson/CAT.

The total purchase for the 2015 JD410K with accessories, 3,000 hour on-site preventative maintenance program and sales tax is \$152,479.39.

Staff also inquired with CA Special District Finance Corporation regarding finance options for the acquisition of this equipment. The Agency could qualify for a 3.5% loan for 60 months. The interest projection for a loan would be approximately \$14,000. Staff is seeking direction from the Board on whether or not to pursue the financing option or pay cash.

SUMMARY

Through the Mojave Water Agency 2014 Integrated Regional Water Management Plan the Agency is seeking grant funding for several projects identified in the plan.

In order to submit funding applications the Board of Directors will need to authorize filing of the applications by resolution as outlined below.

Staff is requesting 100% grant funding for these projects.

BACKGOUND/ANALYSIS

Staff has been actively involved in the Small Water Systems Subcommittee which was formed under the Mojave Water Agency 2014 Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) to assist small water systems in disadvantaged communities. In FY2014/15 MWA funded the Small Water Systems Committee Work Plan to provide services to the small systems. Analysis of the BDVWA projects identified in the IRWMP found that several projects may qualify for either Prop. 1 (aka 2014 Water Bond) or State Revolving Fund grant monies. Four specific projects have been identified as good candidates for grant funding:

- 1. Hi Desert Water District/BDVWA interconnections planning grant;
- 2. Lookout pipeline improvements planning grant;
- 3. Emergency power improvements construction grant for transfer switches and new generator(s);
- 4. BDVWA/W1 system integration planning grant.

Staff has been working with California Rural Water Association, MWA's consultant, to define the projects and begin preparation of the necessary data to develop a grant proposal. These efforts have been funded by MWA to date.

These projects were reviewed in more detail at the April 21, 2015 Planning/ Engineering/ Legislative/ Grant/ Security Committee. There were no objections raised therefore staff is seeking formal support from the Board to continue the effort to find outside funding for these projects.



Clair A. Hill Water Agency Award for Excellence

2015 Entry: Project Summary

In 2014, Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency (BDV), a "small water system" serving approximately 3,050 residents (1,900 service connections) in rural unincorporated San Bernardino County, in partnership with the Mojave Water Agency (MWA), completed a project known as the Ames/Reche Groundwater Storage and Recovery Program (Ames). This capital project, first outlined in the MWA 2004 Integrated Regional Water Management Plan, meets the Clair A. Hill Award criteria for being creative and innovative, fiscally responsible and environmentally sensitive while fostering excellence in a collaborative stakeholder-driven effort among the five participating water supply agencies and locally recognized as a regional solution to local groundwater basin sustainability.

The Ames project was a hallmark of local creativity and innovation as it aimed to develop a mutually cooperative arrangement for management in the Ames Groundwater Basin. The basin underlies the service territory of BDV but several municipal suppliers export from the basin. The other project partners are Hi Desert Water District, Mojave Water Agency, County of San Bernardino Water Zones W-4 (Pioneertown) and Zone W-1 (Landers). From the Ames Basin, these agencies pump a total annual basin production of approximately 1,650 Acre-Ft. In order to avoid costly litigation and court imposed adjudication, these agencies came to accept the management needs and parameters outlined in the BDV Conceptual Model for the Ames Groundwater Basin, Ames Basin Groundwater Management Plan including calibrated MODFLOW groundwater model and water budget, feasibility studies of recharge potential at the preferred location, environmental proceedings in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and all associated state and federal permits (ie. take permit, streambed alteration, mitigation lands, etc.) which eventually led to the design and construction of the groundwater recharge facilities necessary to sustain this critically important native resource. These producers negotiated an agreement which resulted in groundwater production caps, a robust monitoring program administered by MWA (ie. neutral party), a facility to mitigate pumping beyond limits or to "pre-store" State Water Project, development of long-term storage accounting protocols allowing for a "water market" between agencies for the unused native groundwater baselines and implementation of a fee to BDV for utilization of groundwater basin storage underlying the agency boundaries as well as accounting for exportation out of the basin by the other parties and thus loss of non-consumptive return flows. In 2014, the municipal producers, along with MWA acting as our State Water Contractor, voluntarily entered into a Court Approved Stipulated Judgment to finalize this innovative and cooperative groundwater management program. The Judgment marks the completion of the original project concept outlined in the 2004 MWA Integrated Regional Water Management Plan.

Funding for the project came from an Environmental Protection Agency State and Tribal Assistance Grant secured by BDV approximating \$475,000 and a \$1,000,000 grant from MWA. BDV was able to accomplish all project objectives with the funds provided and at no cost to the BDV customers while concurrently providing huge benefit to the customers of Hi Desert Water District and County of San Bernardino who did not provide any capital funding. The BDV Board of Directors has declared that this project marks the completion of a "generational" promise to bring an outside source of water into the Ames Basin to supplement that which is recharged naturally. The project connects the Ames Basin to the State Water Project via a 3,650 foot conveyance pipeline and is designed to recharge up to 1,500 acre-ft annually on 6 acres of federally managed land. The project parameters were designed to specifically meet the participant's demands for imported water well into the future.

From the beginning BDV Staff was determined to avoid environmental conflict in designing this project within the deeply incised Pipes Wash (dry wash) identified as the only and therefore critically important wildlife linkage corridor between the San Bernardino Mountains and the Twentynine Palms Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center. Furthermore, areas within the wash are inhabited by the federally threatened Desert Tortoise. To that end, traditional engineering designs including mass grading/clearing of native vegetation and excavation of "recharge basins" were avoided. Instead the land was used in a manner that promotes biodiversity conservation, environmental education, low-impact outdoor recreation and thus preserves open space and the scenic beauty of the adjacent proposed Black Lava Buttes Area of Critical Environmental Concern (ACEC). This project avoids visual impact by working in close proximity to already disturbed portions of the wash, leaving all native vegetation in place thus minimally disturbing the ground and allowing natural processes to continue. Further minimizing the footprint, the project was located in close proximity to the BDV Morongo Basin Pipeline and metering structure (turnout) which connects Morongo Basin region to the State Water Project delivery system.

Due to limited allocation of State Water Project during 2014, a total of 50 Acre-Ft or 13% of annual demand was recharged at the facility on behalf of BDV. Another 50 Acre-Ft will be delivered this year to this fully operational facility.

Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency believes this project meets all the criteria for consideration of the Clair A. Hill Water Agency Award for Excellence. While the project is not on the scale of an Orange County Water District Groundwater Replenishment System it is, on its own merits, an innovative, fiscally responsible and environmentally sensitive project serving the needs of these severely disadvantaged communities now and long into the future.

A RESOLUTION OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR THE COUNTY OF SAN BERNARDING ORDERING LAFCO 3181 - REORGANIZATION TO INCLUDE ANNEXATIONS TO THE BIGHORN-DESERT VIEW WATER AGENCY; DISSOLUTION OF ZONE W-1 OF COUNTY SERVICE AREA 70 AND FORMATION OF AN IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT OF THE BIGHORN-**DESERT VIEW WATER AGENCY**

WHEREAS, this action is being taken pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code Sections 56000 et seq.); and,

WHEREAS, by policy adopted on December 20, 2000, and amended on November 21, 2001, the Local Agency Formation Commission for the County of San Bernardino ("the Commission") has delegated authority over all protest proceeding functions to the Executive Officer: and.

WHEREAS, the Commission adopted its Resolution No. 3194 on January 21, 2015, making determinations and approving the proposed reorganization as described in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "A-1" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and,

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions for LAFCO 3181, as approved by the Commission, are as follows:

CONDITIONS:

Condition No. 1. The boundaries of this change of organization are approved as set forth in Exhibits "A" and "A-1" attached;

Condition No. 2. The following distinctive short-form designation shall be used through this proceeding: LAFCO 3181;

Condition No. 3. The effective date of this reorganization shall be July 1, 2015;

Condition No. 4. The service area/territory of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1, on the effective date of this reorganization, shall be formed as an improvement district of the Successor District ("Improvement District") and shall be required to maintain separate accounts

for the purposes of keeping the existing assets and liabilities, including, but not limited to, capital funds, assessments and debt obligations of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 isolated and segregated;

Condition No. 5. Upon the effective date of the reorganization, the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency, as Successor District to CSA 70 Zone W-1, shall succeed to all rights, duties, responsibilities, properties (both real and personal), contracts, equipment, assets, liabilities, obligations, functions, executory provisions, entitlements, permits and approvals of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1. It is anticipated that the transition period shall be from the date of completion of the protest process until the effective date of the reorganization assigned (July 1, 2015) allowing for the smooth transition of operations;

Condition No. 6. Upon the effective date of the reorganization, the Improvement District shall receive all reserve fund balances from the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 specifically identified in the Fiscal Year 2014-15 Adopted Reserve Program (Capital Replacement \$358,764 and Capital Expansion \$319,263; total \$678,027) to be held for the benefit of the ratepayers and property owners within the dissolved district. Transactions utilizing these funds shall be accounted for and described in the annual audit/comprehensive financial reports recognizing the improvement district. All other cash on hand or reserve funds shall transfer to the Successor District for use in providing the service to the area of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1;

Condition No. 7. Upon the effective date of the reorganization, the Successor District shall accept all system facilities transferred from the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 in "as is" condition without any payment or repair obligation from the assets of CSA 70 (pursuant to Government Code Section 56886(h)). All system facilities and incidental liabilities, such as accounts payables, contract obligations and customer deposits shall be transferred to the Successor District. All assets including, but not limited to, water production equipment (pumps, storage tanks, etc.), water transfer infrastructure, transmission lines and rights-of-way, rolling stock, tools, office furniture, fixtures and equipment, all lands, buildings, real and personal property and appurtenances held by the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 shall be transferred to the Successor District:

<u>Condition No. 8.</u> The debt obligations of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 (including but not limited to bond debt and its share of Improvement District M of the Mojave Water Agency) shall remain with the ratepayers obligated to repay those debts through assignment to the Improvement District of the Successor District;

Condition No. 9. The existing fees, taxes, assessments, and charges of CSA 70 Zone W-1 shall continue as the Improvement District's fee, taxes, assessment and charges for payment of the obligations for the duration of the debt obligation;

<u>Condition No. 10.</u> Water rates for the CSA 70 Zone W-1 area shall transition to the previously established and authorized current rates of the Bighorn Desert View Water Agency. It is anticipated that the transition shall be phased to allow for transition in operating systems but shall be accomplished by the close of the first fiscal year following the effective date of the reorganization;

Condition No. 11. Upon the effective date of the reorganization, the Successor District shall succeed to all water and capacity rights of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1,

whether wholly or partially owned or held by the extinguishing district and shall succeed to the priorities of use or rights of use of water or capacity rights in any public improvements or facilities or any other property whether real or personal, to which the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 is entitled to upon the effective date of this Reorganization. The successor district shall specifically succeed to all rights and interest held or claimed by the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 under the Ames Judgment under Riverside Superior Court Case 211504;

Condition No. 12. Upon the effective date of the reorganization, the Successor District shall specifically succeed to all rights and interests held or claimed by the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 under all agreements and/or memoranda of understanding with the Department of the Interior, the Bureau of Land Management, the United States Geological Survey, the California Department of Fish and Game, the California Water Quality Control Board and the Regional Water Quality Control Board for the Colorado Region, or any other public agency or private entity with which the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 has an agreement or memoranda of understanding. The Successor District shall also assume all joint use flow agreements and maintenance agreements held by the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 [(Government Code Section 56886(r)]. Amendments of existing agreements shall be completed prior to the effective date to address any changes in service [Government Code Section 56886(r)(v)];

<u>Condition No. 13.</u> The appropriation limit of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 shall be added to the appropriation limit of the Successor District;

Condition No. 14. Upon the effective date of this reorganization, the Successor District and its Improvement District shall succeed to all rights, duties, and obligations of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1 with respect to the enforcement, performance or payment of any outstanding bonds, including revenue bonds, or other contracts and obligations of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1. This reorganization shall not impair any rights of any bondholder or creditor of the dissolved CSA 70 Zone W-1;

<u>Condition No. 15.</u> As of the date of approval of the reorganization by LAFCO through the effective date pursuant to the provisions of Government Code 56885.5(a)(4), the Board of Supervisors of San Bernardino County as the governing body of CSA 70 Zone W-1 shall be prohibited from taking the following actions unless it first finds an emergency situation exists as defined in Government Code Section 54956.5:

- No Increase in Compensation or benefits: No increase in calculation for payment of benefits or compensation to CSA 70 shall be allowed. Exceptions to this prohibition include planned and budgeted increases identified in the adopted budget for Fiscal Year 2014-15.
- Bound by Current Budget: Appropriating, encumbering, expending, or otherwise obligating any revenue of CSA 70 Zone W-1 beyond that provided in the current budget at the time of Commission approval unless agreed to by the Successor District; and,

Condition No. 16. The Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Commission from any legal expense, legal action, or judgment arising out of the commission's approval of this proposal, including any reimbursement of legal fees and costs incurred by the Commission.

WHEREAS, the reason for this proposal, as outlined by the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency, is to take over responsibility of water services and will allow for local control of the residents water service, will allow for a more timely response to periodic issues that may arise, and will provide a means for lower and more stable water rates;

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2015, the Commission, as CEQA lead agency, has determined that this proposal is statutorily exempt from environmental review. This recommendation was based on the finding that the Commission's approval of the reorganization had no potential to cause any adverse effect on the environment. The reorganization proposal will not change the area in which the service is provided; therefore, no physical affect upon the environment can be seen. Therefore, the proposal is exempt from the requirements of CEQA, as outlined in the State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061 (b) (3). The Commission adopted the Statutory Exemption and directed its Executive Officer to file a Notice of Determination within five days; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed reorganization was called for and held by the Executive Officer of this Commission on March 25, 2015, at the time and place for which notice was given, and at the hearing the Executive Officer heard and received all oral and written protests, objections or evidence which were made, presented or filed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Officer hereby determines and orders as follows:

SECTION 1. The value of written landowner protests filed and not withdrawn represents owners of land who own less than 25% of the total assessed value of land within the territory (0.01% of landowners representing 0.39% of the land value). No Written registered voter protests were filed.

SECTION 2. The regular County assessment roll is utilized by the Agency.

SECTION 3. The affected territory will not be taxed for existing general bonded indebtedness and/or contractual obligations of the Agency.

SECTION 4. The Executive Officer, on behalf of the Commission, hereby orders the reorganization as described in Exhibits "A" and "A-1" to include the annexation to the Bighorn Desert View Water Agency and dissolution of County Service Area 70 Zone W-1 and formation of an Improvement District of the Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency.

SECTION 5. The Executive Officer shall cause to be prepared and filed a Certificate of Completion, as required by Government Code Sections 57176 through 57203, and a Statement of Boundary Change, as required by Government Code Section 57204.

Subject: Proposed Employee Funded Post-Retirement Health Insurance Program

SUMMARY

Staff is seeking the Committee's input on an offer to allow retiring employees to continue their health care insurance coverage at no cost to the Agency.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff is seeking direction from the FPREP Committee on how to proceed.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In 2009 the Agency changed its medical insurance provider from Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) to Special Districts Risk Management Authority (SDRMA).

While monitoring the Agendas of other water agencies, staff discovered that our SDRMA health insurance plan may allow employees access to their health insurance plan following retirement. Apparently, this option is not available through ACWA and it was not brought to our attention in 2009 when we executed the plan documents.

Staff is seeking input from the Committee as to whether or not this program should be offered to employees. If this program is made available to retiring employees then they would have some assurances regarding premiums and would be able to take advantage of the larger participant pool at SDRMA with potentially a lower premium than could be obtained elsewhere in the health insurance market. Following age 65 the plan coverage would be coordinated with Medicare.

For the Committees consideration is a program with the following guidelines:

- The retired employee must pay 100% of the costs of the insurance (no liability for the Agency).
- Since the plan requires the Agency to pay the invoices, retired employee must pay premiums two (2) months in advance to insure that if payment is not received in time the plan can be canceled to minimize Agency liability. For clarification, the Agency currently pays medical premiums in advance.

- Employee must have been with the Agency at least 10 years.
- Retirement age must be at least 55 years old.

If the Committee recommends the program be offered then staff would pursue approval through "underwriting". If "underwriting" approves then Staff would take this program to the full Board for further consideration and possible approval.
