#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Vice President McBride made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Director Dicht seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

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### Discussion and Action Items -

 March 9, 2021 Noticed Public Workshop – Overview of Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration - February 2021 for Potable Water System Improvements and Consolidation of Water Systems (Prop. 1 Planning Grant) (Workshop No. 3)

GM West provided a PowerPoint presentation which outlined one-half of the environmental conditions evaluated as part of the Mitigated Negative Declaration document. The schedule was discussed with includes one additional public workshop to be held on April 13, 2021. The public comment period closes on April 20, 2021. Thereafter, all comments will be reviewed and a response generated and incorporated into the document prior to the Board of Directors consideration of its adoption following a Public Hearing on May 11, 2021. Thereafter, staff will seek grant funding for the project.

2. Review Draft Resolution No. 21R-05 Setting the Service Line Installation Fee for Water Meter Size Ranges from 3/4-inch to 10-inch

GM West gave the staff report as included in the Agenda packet noting staff is not proposing any adjustment to the installation fee and that any meter larger than 1-inch be charged actual time and materials.

Vice President McBride made a motion to Resolution No. 21R-05 Setting the Service Line Installation Fee for Water Meter Size Ranges from 3/4-inch to 10-inch. Director Close-Dees seconded the motion.

Ms. Van Patter asked a question for clarification regarding Basic Facility Charges and Service Line Installation Fees.

## 3. Basic Facilities Charge Variance Proposal

GM West gave the staff report as outlined in the Agenda packet. Staff is asking if the Board wants to consider a variance process for three specific customers who had been quoted an installation price prior to the rate change but had not yet submitted an application. GM West introduced Ms. Kelly Van Patter who participated in person. One other customer, Ms. Pew, was unable to attend but is asking the Board to grant her the prior charge.

GM West clarified that she is not requesting the Board reduce the fee but wondered if these persons could be accommodated via a payment plan. The staff report laid out the parameters for such a program. She asked the Board of Directors for their input on how to proceed.

Public Comment and discussion:

Ms. Van Patter spoke on her behalf about her plans to build her own, small, "off grid" home, she would like a reduced fee not a loan. She mentioned that our buy-in rates are as high as Park City, Utah.

Directors made various inquiries about the facts surrounding the timing of Ms. Van Patter's new meter installation request.

GM West commented on behalf of Ms. Pew who is asking the Board to honor the Basic Facilities Charge in place prior to January 12, 2021.

GM West answered questions of the Board on how the fee was calculated and how it compares to other surrounding entities. Directors continued their discussion asking questions of the applicant. She stated she is not asking for a reduction in the price and whether or not the Board would reduce the fee given the unfortunate timing.

Director Dicht's mention the chatter on Facebook regarding the fee when it was advertised around the Agency. Director Burkhart expressed concern about staff time in following a payment plan. Director Close-Dees discussed the Facebook posts as well as discussions she had with a property owner.

Ms. Van Patter reiterated that she is not wanting a payment plan but is really seeking a reduction in price.

Mrs. Burkhart noted that the Agency can't treat one customer different from another citing the "gift of public funds". She doesn't believe the rate can be adjusted for just one customer.

No motion was made to proceed.

She also noted that a director is not obligated to accept the increase but next year the Board cannot ask for 10% if it did not increase it in 2021.

Questions and comments were received from the Board and answered.
