- 7. Verbal Reports Including Reports on Courses/Conferences/Meetings.
 - 1. General Manager Report GM West informed the Board that the Agency had experienced positive coliform at one of the sampling stations during routine monitoring. The Agency also experienced a positive coliform on one of the resamples which results in a Tier 2 Violation of the Title 22 water quality standards. This is a low level violation as the presence of coliform does not, in itself, pose a health risk. The Agency will receive a violation notice and some of our customers will be receiving the required notification in accordance with the directive issued by the State Water Resources Control Board. A third and forth set of samples were obtained on Saturday and Monday, July 11, 2022 and all samples are absent for coliform. Chlorine residual was maintained the entire time and the cause of the detections is not entirely known and may never be.

2. Director Reports

<u>Director Close-Dees</u> reported on the Board of Supervisors meeting held July 12, 2022. She noted the public outcry to the continued Covid disruptions to livelihood. There was protest regarding mandating vaccine for infants.
