Project 6: Replacement Production Well for Goat Mountain System

To Whom It May Concern/Mojave Water Agency

Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency (BDV) has received grant funds as part of the Department of Water Resources Proposition 1/ Round 1 Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Implementation Grant Program for the Colorado River Funding Area in response to the submitted Funding Assistance Application, Funding Agreement Number 4600013807: Project 6: Replacement Production Well for Goat Mountain System.

This project has proceeded through to the formal Public Works process with a Notice Inviting Bids published November 30, 2022. One initial step was to obtain up-to-date costs estimates. It is common knowledge that there have been significant increases in construction costs for materials and labor due to supply chain shortages, inflation, labor shortages from COVID-19 pandemic, and prevailing wage labor rates. The cost estimate now far exceeds the grant award of \$500,000.

The Agency's engineer prepared as estimate for inclusion in the Notice Inviting Bids for the well drilling, construction, testing and abandonment of the old failed well. This estimate is \$571,000 and exceeds the grant award of \$500,000. The Agency was able to review actual bids from a similar project (attached Jubilee Mutual Water Co Bid Opening December 15, 2022) and the actual bids received appear to confirm that costs are rapidly escalating and greatly exceed \$500,000.

The engineers' estimate of \$571,000 and the Jubilee MWC bids do not include the cost to equip the well with pump and motor, connect the well to the utility (So. Cal Edison) and obtain an amended permit from the Division of Drinking Water to activate the well into service. The project was split due to delays in progress on the electrical design (ie. staff shortages) so that the well construction portion could proceed.

In order to meet this challenge, the Agency has re-evaluated its Public Works bid document and has identified several areas where costs savings could be realized. This will require an addendum to the contract and will extend the bid opening date at least to February 2023. Furthermore, contractors are also struggling with staffing levels so the contract anticipates a delay in mobilization as contractors attempt to stage their projects over time.

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The Agency has identified the following changes necessary to reduce the overall cost and still meet the intended objective:

- 1. Increase in the grant award to cover the increased costs due to significant increases in construction costs for materials and labor due to supply chain shortages, inflation, labor shortages from COVID-19 pandemic, and prevailing wage labor rates; and
- 2. Change in project description to remove the "destruction" of the failed well and its associated appurtenances; and
- 3. Provide an extension of time, beyond the current grant deadline, to complete the project due to the changed project description and identified contractor scheduling issues.

The Agency has reviewed the Grant Deliverables and requests the following change in scope which will reduce the overall project cost and still meet the primary project objective to "construct a new production well."

1. <u>Modify Task 11: Construction</u>: Remove Item 11(c): Destroy Failed Well. Agency will convert this failed production well to a static monitoring well for acquisition of water level measurements.

Budget. The Agency has evaluated the financial impact of the requested changes and now estimates the Project will still exceed the grant award of \$500,000. Therefore, the Agency requests consideration for an increase in the grant award to cover the added costs. The actual well drilling, construction and testing bids will be received before the end of Q1/2023.

Schedule Adjustment. The Agency ran into significant delays with its design consultant due to staffing shortages especially in the area of electrical design. In fact, the Agency split off the well drilling, construction and testing work from the electrical design in mid-2022 in order to get the project out to bid. The current Planned End Date for the grant is September 30, 2023. The Agency requests a revised End Date later than *September 30, 2023*.

Dear Ms. Kleeman:

Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency (BDVWA/Agency) has received grant funds as part of the Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Colorado River Funding Area (CRFA) Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Grant in response to the submitted Funding Assistance Application, and in accordance with Funding Agreement Number 4600012245.

Funding is for BDVWA Project 18, Residential Water Meter Replacement Program (Project). The Project has proceeded to engineering design, and the associated public works contract phase was to begin within the first quarter of 2023. One initial step was to obtain up-to-date cost estimates. It is common knowledge that there have been significant increases in construction costs for materials and labor due to supply chain shortages, inflation, labor shortages from the COVID-19 pandemic, and prevailing wage labor rates. The updated estimate is far greater than initially proposed.

It was determined that contracted, prevailing wage labor cost escalation is the most significant barrier to completing the Project with the funds provided. The Agency's engineer, Provost & Pritchard, has prepared the attached memorandum dated January 11, 2023 to support this claim.

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The Agency has identified the following two changes necessary to significantly reduce the overall cost and still meet the intended objective:

- 1. Approval of a shift from utilization of public works contract procurement methods to direct reimbursement of Agency in-house staff resources; and
- 2. Provide maximum extension of time to allow Agency staff to complete the Project while still completing their regular system operation duties.

Work Plan. The Agency has reviewed the Grant Deliverables and requests the following change in the Work Plan, which will reduce the overall Project cost and still meet the Project objective to replace approximately 1,075 "meters to enable users to better understand and control their water usage:"

1. <u>Modify Task 7: Design</u>: Change from Public Works Contract oriented execution to using inhouse personnel.

Change, "The meter locations ... and would be replaced on the existing water service line by a contractor" to read, "The meter locations ... by Agency personnel, tools and equipment."

Change "contractor will develop the contract and prepare minimal specifications as needed..." to read, "existing agency engineer, Provost & Prichard, to develop the minimum specification necessary for the direct procurement by the Agency of the materials needed to complete the Project using Agency personnel, tools and equipment.

Add the following Deliverables:

- Request for Quote for Materials/Supplies (to procure meters and appurtenances (check valves, customer ball valves, etc.) in accordance with Agency Purchasing Policy (Attached)
- Proof of Advertisement/Solicitation of Vendors
- Award of Purchase Order
- 2. <u>Modify Task 9: Contract Services:</u> Delete this section as no Contract Services will be utilized.
- 3. <u>Modify Task 10: Construction Administration</u> Modify language accordingly to remove reference to managing contractor. BDVWA staff will install the meters to Agency standards rather than perform field inspections.

No Change in deliverables specified.

Budget. The Agency has evaluated the financial impact of the requested changes and now estimates the Project can be completed within the grant funding awarded allowing the Agency to complete this important project. The Agency acknowledges that any additional costs will be borne by the Agency unless a budget adjustment is requested and approved by the Grantor. The

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following presents the grant amount detail for Budget Category (d) Construction/Implementation:

Schedule Adjustment. The Agency originally envisioned utilizing "public works" contracting processes to complete the Project in the first half of 2023. However, in order to significantly reduce the Project costs and still meet the intended objectives, the Agency will need to use its own staff resources. Therefore, a time extension is required to complete the Project. The Agency is requesting the maximum extension allowed so the Project can proceed without any further delays in obtaining change approvals. The current Planned End Date is May 31, 2023. The Agency requests a revised End Date of *March 30, 2025*.

In summary, the requested changes in the Work Plan and Schedule will allow efficient use of grant funding and additional time so that the Agency personnel can be utilized to complete the same objective of replacing approximately 1,075 water meters, with approximately 30% additional downstream components, "to provide back flow protection and reduce future potential water loss per hour in the event of an emergency."

Bighorn-Desert View Water Agency (BDV) has currently received grant funds as part of the Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) Colorado River Funding Area (CRFA) Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Grant in response to the submitted Funding Assistance Application, Funding Agreement Number 4600012245. The amount of meters that were planned to be replaced under the current funding agreement is approximately 1,075 meters. The total grant funding awarded for the project is \$298,036.00. The funding for the project was developed and approved in 2017. Since then, there have been significant increases in construction costs for materials and labor due to supply chain shortages, inflation, labor shortages from COVID-19 pandemic, and labor rates.

To provide an idea of how the costs have been impacted, P&P reviewed recent bids and also called general contractors to request current budgetary-level construction cost information. Attached are the budgetary-level cost estimate breakdowns received from two general contractors for the installation of the meters. As noted in the cost estimates, there were two separate material costs obtained for the standard Zenner Multijet meters from Inland Waterworks of San Bernardino and iFlow of Santa Ana.

The first cost estimate from Sierra Construction, Inc. provides a breakdown for the entire project which includes meter replacement installations on all 1,026 service connections, meter box replacement installations on 80 percent of the service connections, and angle meter stops and related plumbing on 45 percent of the service connections. Prevailing wage labor rates, travel, and per diem expenses are included.

The second cost estimate from Golden Meter Services is for meter and meter box installations only. It includes meter replacement installations on all 1,026 service connections and meter box replacement installations on 80 percent of the service connections. It does not include any costs for angle meter stops, check valves, or other plumbing.

As indicated in these cost estimates, additional funding will be needed to cover the entire project as conceived. We recommend BDV work with the funding agency to determine if additional funding is available or if the scope of the project can be modified to provide similar conservation and energy benefits at a lower cost. Some potential modifications include pre-purchasing meters to save on contractor markup and installing meters using agency staff, recognizing that a schedule extension would be required to allow time for agency staff to install the meters while still completing their regular system operation duties.

WHEREAS, the Agency previously adopted Policy Statement No. 04P-02 which established a purchasing authority policy which sets forth the authority and restrictions on the procurement of goods and services; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of this Agency that it maintain limits, restrictions and procedures in a purchasing authority policy; and

WHEREAS, the guidelines set forth within the Purchasing Policy are not intended to address every issue, exception, or contingency may arise in the course of purchasing activities; and

WHEREAS, the basic standard that should always prevail is to exercise good judgement in the use and stewardship of Agency resources, including keeping within the budget authorized by the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to update and revise the Agency's purchasing authority policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Agency do hereby authorize the following:

- 1. Adoption of Purchasing Authority Policy. The Board of Directors does hereby adopt a policy of authority, limits, restrictions, and procedures regarding the purchase of goods, services and public works projects by the District as set forth in that certain Purchasing Authority Policy ("Policy") attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>Purchases Subject to Budgetary Amounts and Authorization.</u> The authority, limits, restrictions and procedures set forth in said Policy shall be subject to any and all applicable annual budgetary amounts and other authorizations as may be imposed by the Board from time to time.
- 3. Policy Shall Be Controlling Over Previous Policies. As of the effective date of this Resolution, the Policy shall be deemed to be controlling over, and shall otherwise supersede, the policy adopted by way of Policy Statement No. 04P-02 and any and all other previous purchasing authority policies that may conflict with, or be contrary to, the Policy. As of the effective date of this Resolution, the policy adopted by way of Policy Statement 04P-02 shall be of no further force or effect.
- 4. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision in this Resolution or Policy, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is for any reason held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Resolution and Policy, or the application of such provisions to other

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persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby. The Board hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and Policy and each provision thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be held invalid.

- 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall become effective upon the date of adoption as set forth herein.
- 6. <u>Incorporation of Recitals.</u> The Recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made an operative part of this Resolution.
